Dear Friends,

Jesus challenged his disciples often. It seems like that is what He asks of us also. Remember when he called the disciples the light of the world and the salt of the earth? I imagine they were pretty flattered by that. But then he adds, “But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot” (Mt 5:13). Ouch. Yikes. Jesus was not afraid to challenge what the disciples thought or the way they lived. In the same way, we too are called to overcome the fear of challenging others and to help our brothers and sisters come closer to Christ and His Church.

With that said, an important reminder is to do it with love. That’s why Jesus challenges us. Not to “lord” his authority over us but rather because He genuinely loves us. That’s why Jesus challenged them. Not to “lord” his authority over them but rather because He genuinely loved them. The Church is called to convert the world because we love the world. (If I’m honest, I wonder sometimes if I really love the world.) We call people to conversion not in an arrogant or self-serving way but because we love them. Husbands correct wives and vice versa. Parents correct their children and teachers correct their students because they love them and want to see them flourish. One of my favorite quotes about evangelization is from St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross who said, “Tell me nothing about truth without love and nothing about love without truth. For one without the other is a destructive lie.” In some, I pray that God would humble them to let their lives be a sufficient witness to the Kingdom. In others, I pray the Holy Spirit give them the words to challenge others with gentleness and kindness. In all, I pray that we will be really proud of our Catholic Christian tradition and let Jesus show us where we ourselves are in need of conversion.



FAITH—August 7, 2022


Our readings today explore how faith begins and how faith works. Faith begins with God’s initiative of love, together with God’s promise about the future. The passage from Hebrews urges readers to have an assured confidence in God, who promised and delivered a lasting legacy to Abraham. The book of Wisdom reminds readers of the God who promised and delivered freedom from slavery during the Exodus. In the Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus begins with the promise that “your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom,” before describing how to live faithfully during times when God seems absent. God’s promises mean that God is fully invested in our future. Living in these promises, we can confidently let go of fear and insecurity. We can anticipate that when God intervenes in our lives, it will be for our benefit. And we can become God’s partners in fulfilling these divine promises.

PROPHETS— August 14, 2022

We reflect upon the voice of the prophet in this Sunday’s readings. We hear of the suffering and the rescue of Jeremiah. We hear how Jesus anticipates His suffering and death. As with Jeremiah and Jesus, the prophets were sent by God to the leaders and people of Israel. A prophet is one who speaks truth to the powerful, exposing their darker hidden motives and injustices. The prophet presents a way forward that aligns with God’s purposes. A prophet can force people away from a comfortable neutrality or indifference. The prophet creates an urgency to make a choice: Are we content with the status quo, or are we to change our ways and pursue a new and better path? Today, we may also ask, how do we identify and respond to prophets of our time? How might we provide a prophetic voice in our Church and in our world?

Assumption of the Virgin Mary

Assumption of Mary—August 15, 2022

One glance at a daily newspaper or a television news show will tell you that some people do not value human life. But this is not news. During the Holocaust of World War II, millions of people were tortured and killed. This terrible tragedy led many people to wonder about human life. How valuable is a single human life? How valuable are the lives of the elderly, the unborn, the terminally ill? Are their lives worth as much as those of people who are healthy and active, working, and raising families?

God creates human life and gives it value. And Jesus gave his life on the cross to redeem each individual human person. By doing this, Jesus said, “Your life is worth my dying to save you.” Through his own Resurrection, Jesus showed us the glory of our resurrection and of our living in the Holy Spirit. Jesus promised that the body and soul of a person, separated at death, will be joined together again in glory at the Last Judgment. The person will be whole for all eternity.

The feast of Mary’s Assumption is a preview of what our lives will be. At the end of her earthly life, Mary was assumed, or taken up, into heaven body and soul. She did not have to wait for the end of the world, as we do. God granted her this special privilege because of her sinlessness and her fullness of grace.

The Church has always believed in Mary’s assumption into heaven. But on November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII focused the attention of the whole world on the Assumption of Mary as a dogma and mystery of our faith. This mystery shows us that God wants every human person, body and soul, to be in glory forever, just as Mary is now. This dogma shows how important every single human life is. Pope Plus XII hoped that by thinking about Mary’s Assumption, people all over the world would develop a deeper respect for their own lives and their own bodies. He also hoped that people would grow in respect for the lives of others.





Our Lady of Hope's History

Our Lady of Hope Church

Prior to 1910, the Des Plaines-Rosemont area was predominantly Protestant. In that year, the Zieke family moved to a farm just east of what is now Our Lady of Hope School on Higgins Rd. They were followed by other Catholic families: Ila Byrne Duntemann in 1914; the Frymark family about 1920; Mr. and Mrs. John Byrne in 1925; and Joseph Trier about 1929.

It appears that the few Catholic families in the area attended Mass at St. Paul of the Cross Church in Park Ridge. Later, Catholics living north of Higgins Rd. attended St. Mary Church in Des Plaines while those living south of Higgins Rd. travelled to St. Beatrice Church in Schiller Park. The real growth of the Des Plaines-Rosemont area took place following World War II and the need for a Catholic parish became apparent.

In June 1957, Samuel Cardinal Stritch appointed Rev. Francis J. Buck, a former assistant at St. Thomas Aquinas Church in Chicago, to organize a parish in the territory between Schiller Park and Des Plaines. Through the generosity of the Sisters of Mercy, Masses were held for a year in the chapel of St. Patrick Academy at Touhy Ave. and Lee St. in Des Plaines.

Approximately 300 families formed the nucleus of Our Lady of Hope parish. Father Buck took up residence in the house of Charles and Dorothy Skrip for two months until a home was purchased at 3122 Stillwell Dr. in Des Plaines. This house was outfitted as a rectory and the basement was remodeled as a chapel. Here Father Buck offered daily Mass and administered the Sacraments. Approximately 100 children then enrolled in the public schools attended catechism classes held in the homes of the Skrip family and the Dierks family on Stillwell Dr. On May 30, 1958, 31 children received their First Holy Communion in ceremonies at St. Patrick Academy.

Within a few months, an Altar and Rosary Society and a Holy Name Society were in operation. In January 1958, negotiations began for the vacant triangular parcel of real estate bounded by Higgins Rd., Devon Ave, and Douglas Dr. Father Buck was informed by letter on Feb. 17, 1958 that the transaction for purchase of the parish site was complete. A contract was signed on March 19, 1958 for the construction of a combination church-school building, and ground was broken on May 11, 1958. At the time of the cornerstone laying on September 21, 1958, the boundaries of Our Lady of Hope parish had been set as follows: North-Touhy Ave. South-Foster Ave. West-Wolf Rd East-Dee Rd. and Talcott Ave. The parish included all of the village of Rosemont and that portion of Des Plaines which lay south of Touhy Ave.

Mass in the new church quarters was celebrated for the first time on Christmas Eve 1958. In September 1959, the Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth opened Our Lady of Hope School with an enrollment of 184 children in grades one through four. Additional grades were added each year and the first class to complete the entire eight grades was graduated in June 1967.

The architectural firm of Vitzhum and Tesch designed Our Lady of Hope complex in such a way that every space would be utilized. The modern brick structure contains church quarters, classrooms, an assembly hall and convent. Albert Cardinal Meyer dedicated Our Lady of Hope church on May 30, 1959. A new rectory, completed in 1966 at 9711 W. Devon Ave., includes living quarters for the priests, guest rooms, and Meyer Hall, a much needed meeting room.

Beginning in 1959, priests from Our Lady of Hope Church celebrated Mass each Sunday at 5:15 a.m. at O'Hare Airport. Construction was then underway on the present airport facilities which were dedicated on March 23, 1963 by President John F. Kennedy. To meet the needs of Catholic employees and travelers, John Cardinal Cody established the Community of Our Lady of Loreto in 1966 under the direction of Rev. John J. Keough, a former assistant at Our Lady of Hope Church. On November 1, 1967, the Cardinal officiated at ceremonies marking the first anniversary of the interdenominational chapel at O'Hare Airport. He announced that the chapel had been raised to the status of public oratory and that Father Keough had been named rector. Our Lady of Loreto Church functions as a non-residential parish.


Over the years, priests from Our Lady of Hope Church and from Our Lady of Loreto Church assisted at air crashes. The most recent disaster involved a DC 10 airplane which crashed on May 25, 1979 shortly after takeoff from O'Hare field killing all 273 passengers aboard.

The rapid growth of Our Lady of Hope parish has led to changes in the structure of the Religious Education Program namely the establishment of the Sunday School, high school "Rap Session," and the Committee for Adult Education. A full time Religious Education coordinator directs the CCD program which enrolls approximately 400 children. The Parish School Board and Parish Council take an active part in decision-making and through their efforts, many new policies have been implemented. The 20th anniversary of Our Lady of Hope parish was celebrated on May 21, 1977 with a dinner dance at the Penthouse Ballroom of the O'Hare Ramada Inn. Parish membership then numbered approximately 900 families. In 1978, 142 children were enrolled in the parish school under the direction of three Sisters of the Holy Family of Nazareth and five lay teachers. Named pastor emeritus in June 1979, Father Buck continued to reside in the parish rectory until his death on September 8, 1979. He came to Des Plaines from St. Mary Church on 137th St. in Chicago where he had been serving as administrator since January 1979.



Gift of Godparents
