Synod 2021– 2023



On Sunday, October 24, 2021, Cardinal Blase Cupich celebrated a Mass for a Synod at Holy Name Cathedral, opening the process for the Archdiocese of Chicago. Pope Francis has said that “the purpose of this Synod, is not to produce documents, but to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands.” (Preparatory Document, #32) In mid-September, the Pope said: The Synod is for everyone, and it is meant to include everyone. The Archdiocese of Chicago has provided the web page www.archchicago.org/news-and-events/synod to the people to share their reflections. Scan the QR code with your smartphone and take a moment to explore, to pray, and to share your comments on communion, participation, and mission.



Fundamental Question

A synodal church, in announcing the Gospel, “journeys together”.

How is this “journeying together” happening today in your local Church?

What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our “journeying together”?

As you respond.....

Recall our experiences: What experiences of our local Church does this question call to mind?

Re-read these experiences in greater depth: What joys did they bring? What difficulties and obstacles have they encountered? What wounds did they reveal? What insights have they elicited?

Gather the fruits to share: Where in these experiences does the voice of the Holy Spirit resound? What is the Spirit asking of us? What are the points to be confirmed, the prospects for change, the steps to be taken? Where do we register a consensus? What paths are opening up for our local Church?

Communion

In the Church and in society we are side by side on the same road. How are we called to grow as companions? Listening is the first step, but it requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice. All are invited to speak with courage and parrhesia, or bold and forthright speaking; that is, in freedom, truth and charity.

Who are those in the margins in our local community? How do we encounter them and listen to their voices? How does what we hear inform how we journey together?

Participation

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (Vatican II, 1963) called all the faithful to that full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations. What has that come to mean in our post-pandemic church? Can we maintain participation without people at Sunday worship?

Synodality is at the service of the mission of the Church in which all members are called to participate.

Mission

Sunday worship is the most visible aspect of our religion. The church’s mission also includes service, evangelization, healing, and teaching.

Does our faith steer us when making decisions and weighing values?

Does it bring consolation? Does it challenge you to sacrifice?

Synodality entails receptivity to change, formation and ongoing learning.

Above all the Church works for justice, peace and respect for all human life.





Prepare your home with Lenten reminders. If you have no crucifix in your living areas, place one there.

- If possible and safe, take your family to the Stations of the Cross at least once.
- Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and encourage your family to do so.
- Make it a point to prepare for and participate in the beautiful Triduum liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and even the Easter Vigil even if you can only do this online. Celebrate the completion of your Lenten exercises.
- After Easter, reflect on your Lenten practices. Remember, God's mercy to us is unlimited. It's not all about what "we" did, but what God does within us.

Lenten Regulations

- Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 60.
- Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.

As a daily meditation, during Lent, we offer to our parishioners the "Little Black Book", published by the Diocese of Saginaw, MI. Lighting System

We are half way through of installing the new lighting in the church. I was told we are on schedule, and we should be finished in time to celebrate Holy week and Easter Sunday in the church.



The new lighting will eliminate annual lighting maintenance, brighten and “enlarge” visually the entire space, eliminate heat from the lighting in the Chancel (important for those wearing vestments...Father will not need the fan under the altar anymore), as LED has no ultraviolet component, add color changing and auto zoom for the whole Chancel area, and finally, the new wireless controls will allow us to better integrate the nearly endless new lighting options into our overall liturgical services. We appreciate your patience and cooperation during this time to complete this much needed project.

During this time of Covid, the decision was made to have the tabernacle remain in the sanctuary, with that we need to provide a safe and secure space for the tabernacle. We have requested T.H. Stemper Company to submit drawings for a new tabernacle stand that will match the existing sanctuary furnishings. As well as adding some other pieces that would match and complete a more cohesive design on the Altar. The additional furnishings would include: a Presider lectern; Wedding and Urn table; Credence Table; Baptismal Candle Stand integrated into the existing Baptismal Font; Gift and Piano tables; and smaller Presider and Deacon Chairs.

The cost of the new furnishings for the sanctuary will be paid through donations. THE GRIEFSHARE PROGRAM RETURNS TO ST. PAUL OF THE CROSS

This program features biblical, Christ-centered teaching that focuses on grief topics associated with the death of a loved one. The DVD seminar features nationally respected grief experts and real-life stories of people, followed by a small group discussion about what was viewed. Past participants have said how helpful the information and follow-up discussions were to them.

Many grieving people find they are only beginning the work of healing when friends or families have returned to their daily life routines. Too often people, including Christians, tend to stuff their grief instead of allowing it to do the God-given work for which it is intended. Confidentiality is a big part of this program.

Your bereavement experience may be recent or not so recent. You will find encouragement, comfort, and help in grieving the death of a spouse, child, parent, sibling, other family member, or friend. This is an opportunity to be around people who understand what you are feeling and going through. You will learn how to recognize the symptoms of being stuck in grief and how to move through the process. You will learn valuable information about facing your new normal in life and renewing your hope for the future.
