



As we begin our Lenten journey this year, our hearts and minds are with the people of Ukraine as they experience the horror of a very violent war. We see their bravery and their fight for freedom and independence. Maybe we wonder if there is anything we can do to help them. So, here is what I propose to all of us as our Lenten resolution. First, pray for peace using Pope Francis' prayer below. If you can, please join our community for the Stations of the Cross on Fridays, or pray the stations alone or with your family at home. Come and pray the Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Help on Wednesdays after morning Mass. Second, support financially any organization that promotes peace in Ukraine. On Ash Wednesday Catholics around the country were asked to provide financial aid to the people of Ukraine. If you would like to make a donation contact the mission office. Third, on all Fridays of Lent, as we are required to abstain from eating meat, offer this little sacrifice for peace in Ukraine. If you are able, add one extra day of fasting every week during Lent. May this year's Lent be a time of praying, fasting, and almsgiving to support peace in Ukraine.

### **Pope Francis' Prayer for Peace**

Lord God of peace, hear our prayer!

We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. How many moments of hostility and darkness have we experienced; how much blood has been shed; how many lives have been shattered; how many hopes have been buried... But our efforts have been in vain.

Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts, and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instill in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam!

### Lenten Regulations

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 60.

Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. The special Paschal fast, as well as abstinence, are prescribed for Good Friday and encouraged for Holy Saturday.



For some it is a time of healing, an opportunity to repair their spiritual brokenness. For others, it is simply a good time to cultivate their spiritual lives in a more disciplined manner.

## THIS WEEK AT HOME

### Monday, March 7 Whatever You Did for the Least

Treasure in heaven is not measured in numbers, wealth, or possessions. God invites us over and over to turn toward Jesus and follow him. In these days leading up to Lent, set aside time to prepare for this season of repentance and baptismal renewal. What will you let go of, detach yourself from, and surrender to, in order to have a fruitful and meaningful Lent? Today's readings: 1 Peter 1:3-9; Psalm 111:1-2, 5-6, 9 and 10c; Mark 10:17-27

### Tuesday, March 8 Word and Will

Peter seems to express frustration with having given up everything to follow Jesus. Jesus' way is to rely solely on God. When our life is for the sake of the Gospel, we will receive more than we can imagine. Jesus' words contain a challenge, and this Lent can help us deepen our understanding that love, sacrifice, joy, and sorrow are all part of life. Decide today how to schedule prayer time for every day of Lent. Today's readings: 1 Peter 1:10-16; Psalm 98:1,

### Wednesday, March 9 Forgive Us Our Sins

Through the prophet Joel, God invites us to rend our hearts this day, and return to the everlasting love that has no bounds, no limits, no conditions. Our heavenly Father asks us to return with our whole heart, and not make a lukewarm response to this invitation. Fully embrace this holy season of Lent, which gives us a chance to refocus our priorities and redirect our energies, so that we can follow Jesus. Today's readings: Joel 2:12-18; Psalm 51:3-4, 5-6ab, 12-13, 14 and 17; 2 Corinthians

### Thursday, March 10 Be Attentive

Each of us makes hundreds of choices daily, from what to wear to how to regard the people who come into our lives. St. Katharine Drexel, whose feast day is today, treated people of every race with respect and cared for those whom society shunned. She chose discipleship over a life of privilege. Make an effort today to lose your life for the sake of the cross and, in so doing, choose life. This Lent can be a time to commit to a transformation in your life. Today's readings: Deuteronomy 30:15-20; Psalm 1:1-2, 3, 4, and 6; Luke 9:22-25.

### Friday, March 11 Reconciliation

Cleanse My Heart The Church prays Psalm 51 often during Lent. The psalm is one of the great laments in the Book of Psalms, part of the wisdom literature in the Bible. While praying a lament, we join the psalmist in a plea for mercy and forgiveness. As you pray Psalm 51 today, notice how your heart responds to the moving words that believers have prayed for over two millennia. Today's readings: Isaiah 58:1-9a; Psalm 51:3-4, 5-6ab, 18-19; Matthew 9:14-15.

### Saturday, March 12 Blessed Are They

Teach Me Your Way The prophet Isaiah says, "If you lavish your food on the hungry / and satisfy the afflicted; / Then your light shall rise in the darkness." Who has shown you that "your light shall rise" by acting justly and removing oppressive words from speech? Who has given you courage to follow Jesus even when others may ignore their faith? Make an effort today to express your gratitude to those persons for the truth they have shared. Decide how you will share that truth with some one else today. Today's readings: Isaiah 58:9b-14; Psalm 86:1-2, 3-4, 5-6; Luke 5:27-32

## THIS WEEK AT HOME

### Monday, March 14 Share Mercy

Today's Gospel calls us to "be merciful." Merciful actions beget mercy. "The measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you," Jesus tells the disciples. Act on one of the seven corporal works of mercy: feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the imprisoned, bury the dead, give alms to the poor. Today's readings: Daniel 9:4b-10; Psalm 79:8, 9, 11; Luke 6:36-38.

### Tuesday, March 15 Truly Humble

People often tout their accomplishments and their status. Jesus' message today is contrary to such behavior. He tells us that the greatest among us must be a servant, and that those who are humble will be exalted. Seek to be conscious of whether you are boastful. When we act as the person God created us to be, there is no need to boast, for each one of us is made in God's image and likeness. Today's readings: Isaiah 1:10, 16-20; Psalm 50:8-9, 16bc-17, 21, and 23; Matthew 23:1-12.

### Wednesday, March 16 Service

Jeremiah was a young prophet. When first called by God, he didn't want the job. He knew it would be tough to challenge people who were not following God's ways. Christians today can be wary of taking on their call as disciples. Jesus asks us to serve without seeking favor. For many of us such service is difficult. How will you follow Jesus today by serving others? Today's readings: Jeremiah 18:18-20; Psalm 31:5-6, 14, 15-16; Matthew 20:17-28.

### Thursday, March 17 Priorities

Lying at the rich man's door, Lazarus would have liked to receive any bit of food. The rich man did not heed the poor any more than he was attentive to Moses and the prophets. Many things vie for our attention. Where do you put your focus: on Christian teachings and Scripture or on more earthly things? Make a list today of your top ten priorities. Where does God fall on the list? Today's readings: Jeremiah 17:5-10; Psalm 1:1-2, 3, 4, and 6; Luke 16:19-31.

### Friday, March 18 Faith during Adversity

Jealousy, hatred, vengeful feelings are strong human emotions that can be at the root of poor choices. Cyril of Jerusalem, whose feast day is today, was treated unjustly by his contemporaries but remained faithful. He was the bishop of Jerusalem and later named a doctor of the church. He is known for his homilies that prepared catechumens for initiation into the Church. Today's readings: Genesis 37:3-4, 12-13a, 17b-28a; Psalm 105:16-17, 18-19, 20-21; Matthew 21:33-43, 45-46.

### Saturday, March 19 St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary

As we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we hear in the Gospel that Joseph is "a righteous man" unwilling to expose Mary to shame. When an angel visited Joseph in a dream, he showed great trust and confidence in God's plan for him and Mary. Joseph is the patron of the universal Church. Pray through the intercession of St. Joseph today, mindful of his example of faith. Today's readings: 2 Samuel 7:4-5a, 12-14a, 16; Psalm 89:2-3, 4-5, 27, and 29; Romans 4:13, 16-18, 22; Matthew 1:16, 18-21, 24a.

# LENTEN

## MUSICAL INSIGHTS

During the season of Lent we are called to deepen our relationship with Jesus through increased prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. You will notice a shift in musical selections at our liturgies. While remaining vibrant and prayerful, the selections for this season will call on us to more deeply reflect on the text and themes of the season.

The Communion Rite hymn “Take O, Take Me As I Am” will be the most noticeable piece that embodies this theme. The Communion Rite begins with the Lord’s Prayer, the most universal of the Christian prayers. “Union” is at the heart of the word “communion”. After all, our personal union with Christ at the time of Communion is pivotal. To further foster this personal unity with Christ as a community, the communion hymn will be our “anchor hymn” for this penitential time. What does this mean? Instead of rotating communion hymns each week, the hymn will remain the same throughout Lent. Additionally, the hymn will begin with the Lamb of God (Agnus Dei) and continue until the communal procession is complete.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal indicates that our song throughout the communion rite expresses our unity of spirit through the unity of our voices. This symbolism makes the Communion Rite an act of community rather than processional of individuals. “...purpose being to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to bring out more clearly the “communitarian” character of the procession to receive the Eucharist” (GIRM 86)

The text for the hymn is below! Prayerfully consider joining us in song this Lent if you haven’t in the past.

If you do not receive our bags and wish to help, fill your own lunch bags with the following items and bring them to church the weekend of March 19/20. These will be delivered to the homeless and less fortunate in and around Chicago.

Bags should include:

- ◆ **2 meat sandwiches on white or whole wheat bread (no mayonnaise or butter)**
- ◆ **2 hard boiled eggs (Please do not peel shell.)**
- ◆ **1 small bag of potato chips**
- ◆ **1 piece of fruit (apple, banana or orange)**
- ◆ **2 cookies or a small candy bar**
- ◆ **paper napkin**
- ◆ **Juice box or small drink (No glass bottles.) (Please no condiments.)**
