A note from Colleen Case (Mission Coordinator)

Dear Friends,

I have had a recurring theme in my conversations and quiet times this week. It is the theme of prayer. Maybe it is because October is the month we dedicate to praying the rosary. Or perhaps it is because I am so keenly aware of all we desire to see God in our faith communities, and that no good work and sustaining fruits happen without continually praying and seeking God first. Or it is just the way I am wired. I have always had a deep need for time with God. As I continue to walk this life of faith, I have learned that prayer is not just something we do in church. We sometimes have that mindset, and keep prayer tucked neatly away in our little Sunday box marked church. However, anyone who has navigated tough times in their life, or the loss of a loved one, or a job, or just worn weary from the fray of navigating our busy lives, knows that prayer is much, much, MORE.

First and most basically, prayer is simply having a conversation with God. And might I add, it is about having an honest conversation with God. After all God *does* know our hearts. He knows everything that we carry in worry, our anxiety, or fear, or exhaustion, it is us who often do not know our own hearts. God does, and He wants to be invited into our journey and our struggles. Which of course is really prayer.

As Catholics, we have a great treasure of the formal practice of prayer: Adoration, Novenas, the Rosary, Scripture, Liturgy of the Hours, the great prayers of our faith, the Our Father, Apostles Creed, and the many prayers passed on to us through the saints. Of course, our highest form of prayer – the Holy Mass. But how are we doing daily? How aware are we of God's presence with us throughout the day? How intentional are we in starting our day before our feet hit the floor and thanking God for the gift of another day? And inviting Him into our day? How intentional are we in inviting God into every circumstance of our day? Each encounter of our day?

Prayer is more than just conversation, it is an exchange, it is relational. We give to God, everything, which of course, presupposes that we stop and are mindful enough to do this. In exchange we receive Him, and His peace, His provision for us. We say this every time we pray the Our Father.

So, my invitation is a simple invitation. PRAY! For those of you who have a regular prayer practice, keep at it, and then pray all throughout your day. For those who really do not have a prayer practice, I share one of my favorite prayers, short and simple: Lord Jesus – I give everyone and everything to YOU! I say this many times a day. This reminds of the correct order of things, and it reminds me that I am not alone, and I am not meant to do this day alone. I am meant to walk this day – with the LORD.

Prayer is something we have always done well here at OLH. And something we will be expanding. So, to those of you who pray the rosary here every Monday & Wednesday - thank you! And to those of you who pray in your prayer spaces at home - thank you! Keep praying. And to those who are not as practiced – keep it simple.

Lord Jesus – I give everyone and everything to YOU!

We Pray For Those on the Margins, Especially the Food Insecure

Those who are hungry, homeless and without a job are our brothers and sisters, members of God's family. As disciples we can appreciate that their wellbeing is linked to ours, and understand God's concern that their basic needs are met, and that their full participation in society is necessary.

Well over forty million Americans live in poverty. There are more than twenty million unemployed and underemployed workers searching for a decent job. These are people in our families, neighborhoods and parishes. Persons living in poverty are especially vulnerable to hunger. The *scandal of hunger*, about which Pope Francis has spoken, calls us to reach out to our hungry neighbors, those the Lord speaks of in Matthew 25.

The God of creation and mercy inspires us to pursue justice and solidarity. Families, communities, the market, and government must work together to overcome poverty. All have a responsibility to respond generously, patiently and creatively to the needs of those in our families and communities.



Lunch bags for the Sandwich Ministry are being distributed on Sunday, October 23 after every Mass. Please take the bags home, fill them with the items listed and bring them back to church the following weekend. We will be collecting the lunches before every Mass on Sunday, October 30. No lunches will be collected after 10:30 a.m. Mass begins.

- ◆ 2 hard boiled eggs (Please do not peel shell.)
- ◆ 1 small bag of potato chips
- ◆ 1 piece of fruit (apple, banana or orange)
- ◆ 2 cookies or a small candy bar
- ◆ paper napkin
- ◆ Juice box or small drink (No glass bottles.)






Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On October 23 we join Catholics worldwide in the annual Eucharistic celebration of World Mission Sunday. We remember our common call to both live the mission that is entrusted to us and proclaim the person of Christ and His message. Pope Francis reflects on this year's theme: "You shall be my witnesses" (Acts 1:8). He emphasizes the call to every Christian to bear witness to Christ, to participate in a mission of universal evangelization, and to seek strength and guidance from the Holy Spirit.

Beginning in 1822, the universal fund of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith provided approximately seven million dollars in help to the new and growing Church in the United States. Blessed Pauline Jaricot began this work 200 years ago and established a network of prayer and collections for missionaries so that the faithful could actively participate in the mission "to the ends of the earth." Her vision would lead to World Mission Sunday, which helps the Pope support global missionary activity.

Your prayers and generous support today sustain communities of faith in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe as they proclaim the Gospel, build the Church, and serve the poor. When you contribute to the World Mission Sunday collection, you provide for the formation of our seminarians and religious men and women. You assist in building the schools and orphanages that care for children in places few visit. Missionaries can build churches in areas with scarce resources. Priests, religious Sisters and Brothers, and lay leaders can buy food and the bare essentials that make it possible to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

In this bicentennial anniversary year, I encourage your generosity on World Mission Sunday. Your prayers remain your greatest gift, and your financial support is life-giving to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities.
