# Reflections from Fr. Derek Ho

December 11, 2022

Dear Friends,

**Happy Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday!** We are now midway through the Advent, a season of hopeful expectation. Please continue to challenge yourself to find time for personal reflection on the true meaning of the Christmas celebration. Only two weeks left!

I advocate for at least 15 minutes per day. God cares so much for us that He would lower the Heavens and come down. What a mystery to behold! In the 17<sup>th</sup> century, French philosopher and Catholic writer Blaise Paschal said, "All of humanity's problems stem from man's inability to sit quietly in a room alone." If at the end of the day you find that you're just too tired to do 15, then give 10 minutes. If you can't give 10, give 5. But do it every day. And do it with great intention. Use the time to set aside life's daily distractions. Read an Infancy narrative in one of the Gospels. Pray the rosary (or a few decades). Reflect on an Advent figure- the Prophet Isaiah, John the Baptist, Mary, or Joseph. Come to a daily Mass during the week. Behold the mystery of the Incarnation and let it change you.

And just as a reminder, when we pray we don't just pray to seek out good feelings. Intensity of emotion in prayer is great, but no one experiences that all the time (or even most of the time). Our consistency and dependence are much more important because in them, we express a deep desire to know God intimately.

As you seek God, consider the church the place of encounter. Come early to Mass. Stay after. To help, I'd like to ask all of us to keep the church proper a place of reverent silence. We refrain from making unnecessary noise, shouting, and clapping. We want newcomers to encounter what we encounter when we come to church- the presence of God in the Blessed Sacrament. We are sending a message by the way we act in church... prayerful respect for God or treating the space as a social club meeting? We can and should smile and wave at one another, but we should also be mindful where we are. And if someone breaks the silence, don't flash an angry look or shush them. That's not the spirit of silence. The church building is the most sacred place in the community. Let us recover a sense of the sacred here and let it lead us *prayerfully* into the joy of the Christmas season.

## Bringing the Little One's to Christ

Many of you have chosen for your child, the Catholic Faith, when you first presented them to us to be Baptized. We here at Our Lady of Hope Church have opened our worship space to you by offering you and your child the opportunity to learn what it means to be "Catholic". What do we believe? How do we express our beliefs? How do you communicate with the God we believe in? Little People's Church(LPC) which is conducted the first three Sundays of the month, during the 10:30 am Mass.

During a recent LPC catechetical session the children had the opportunity to re-enact what happened to them when they were first Baptized. Acting as the parents, godparents, and guest with a baby doll (representing them) Mrs. Reardon, the catechist as the priest went through the entire Baptismal Ceremony. This hands-on visual and tactile experience helped the children understand how they become a member of the church and make more sense of what they were learning from week to week.




## OUR FASCINATING FAITH

### Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12)

Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, first appeared to Cuauhtlatzin (Juan Diego) on December 9, 1531 while he was on his way to a Eucharistic celebration in Tlatelolco, Mexico. The Virgin addressed him by his indigenous name, asking him to go to the palace of Archbishop Zumárraga to request that a shrine be erected there at the site of the apparition, in Tepeyac, so as to share her love and compassion for all believers. Juan Diego did so, but the archbishop did not believe him, demanding proof of his story and of the Lady's identity. He returned to Our Lady daily, and on December 12, he conveyed to her the archbishop's request for proof. She showed him Castilian roses blooming there through the stony ground despite the winter's cold. He picked the flowers and carried them in his *tilma* (mantle) to the archbishop. When he unfolded his *tilma* to present the roses, Mary's image was imprinted on the mantle! Her blue sash and the flower over her womb were traditional Aztec symbols of pregnancy and new life. But her features were those of a *mestiza*, indicating mixed Aztec-European heritage. Thus Our Lady of Guadalupe remains the enduring icon of unity-in-diversity, the fruit of our one baptism into Jesus, her Son.



On the Third Sunday of Advent, our parishes will be conducting the Retirement Fund for Religious collection, an annual appeal that benefits nearly 25,000 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests. # Financial Statement of Our Lady of Hope Mission

Hello OLH community,

It is my responsibility as the chair of the Finance Committee to present the parish finances each year. The spreadsheet nearby is the same format that we've been using for several years so it should be familiar to you.

Here are the highlights for the year ended 6/30/2022:

- ◆ Total income was \$374,379. This is approximately the same as last year. Thank you for your generosity.
- ◆ Collection and fundraising income continues to be significantly lower than the pre-pandemic era.
- ◆ Total expenses were approximately the same as last year. Higher liturgical and insurance expenses were balanced by lower employee costs.
- ◆ Expenses significantly exceeded income so the operating loss was \$259,593. This amount was taken from our parish savings to cover our bills.
- ◆ Capital improvements were \$211,190. The improvements include the new church lighting, church flooring, tuck-pointing, and rectory repairs. These funds were also taken from our savings.
- ◆ Due to market conditions, unrealized investment gains were \$30,033. This was significantly lower than last year.
